PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dear Bendigo District RSL Sub-Branch Members and Families,

I hope this report again finds you all in good health and high spirits in the busy lead up to the festive season. We have another busy reporting period where many opportunities were exploited, planned and others are now under consideration.

Welfare has been exceptionally busy as things get tougher in the current stressed financial climate. This time of the year can be especially stressful when Veterans may need the extra support that is sometimes missing.



Our thoughts and work are orientated to all veterans and their dependents, especially during this time. Welfare and well-being of our Veterans is our first and foremost consideration.

Outreach and Engagement:

Our Sub-Branch continues to be busy across many areas in our buildings, locality and wider region. The Sub-Branch has provided financial and welfare advocacy support to veterans and provide them with provisions to assist in making a difference.

We continue to engage with our Veterans through Veterans' events including veteran nights, morning teas, informal gatherings and our esteemed sheds programs. Our veterans and veteran community are busy at the Bendigo Military Museum through cataloguing, filing, research and providing tours of the museum for individuals and groups from near and far.

We continue to work with RSL State Executive through leadership and administration support, the Region (through our RSL Region 7) and other Ex Service Organisations in supporting our Veterans. The recent Region 7 Meeting in Woodend went well with challenges shared, compared, tabled and many solved.

Our Commemorative Sub Committee have had a busy time with Beersheba Day, Remembrance Day, and other events. Our Appeals volunteers have used the lead up to Remembrance Day for the annual Poppy Appeal that is one of our largest fundraisers. A substantial amount of much needed funds was raised.

The Central Victorian Veterans Group continues to grow with many new veterans and families attending our Veteran's Friday night. Figures of up to 69 veterans have been recorded on these events. Fellowship, friendship and a great atmosphere are the common observations from many.

Welfare and Wellbeing Programs:

Our Welfare Branch has been busy with visits and outreach. The festive season will bring a surge in welfare challenges. Our Welfare Advocate Pete French and the Welfare Committee has connected many veterans in our community to the required services through advocacy. Maintaining engagement with Veterans have taken considerable work by many involved.

Our Health and Wellbeing programs continue to attract Veterans from a wider area than just Bendigo. The Castlemaine to Maldon Historic Train hosted Veterans from Bendigo, Keilor East, Wangaratta, Kyabram, Wonthaggi, Ararat, Melton and current serving members from Puckapunyal.



Our Sandown Historic race event allowed Veterans to be part of historic motor racing and be together for Remembrance Day in a unique way.

Advocacy and Recognition:

We have been in discussion with Victorian State Politicians regarding the Gaming Reform Bill before the parliament. Many politicians have been engaged with by the Sub-Branch and the Victorian RSL State Branch. Further arbitration is anticipated however we are giving our 10A Sub-Branch the best opportunity to be heard and have voiced our concerns into how we can sustain

our Veteran programs with a potential roll-back due to gaming reform; watch this space.

Community Engagement:

Our organisation continues to be seen as a beacon for currency and reputation. Our Bendgo Military Museum offers an opportunity for the wider population to immerse in our proud military history. Year 9 students submitted their research for perusal by Museum Staff and it was wonderful to see a student awarded for exemplary work.

Our Central Victorian Veterans Events, Motor Racing, Sheds program, Health and Wellbeing programs are helping veterans be able to actively participate in opportunities.

Sub-Branch Committee:

Some changes in our RSL Leadership; Jeff Crust has moved from Committee Member to Senior Vice President. Jeff has many years as President of the Elmore RSL before that Sub-Branch closed down. Jeff is valued and is very much part of the Bendigo District RSL Sub-Branch. Paul Stevenson has moved from Secretary to Vice President. Paul has been very much appreciated in our governance as Secretary and has set a precedence that will be very hard to follow. Dale Hannaford has moved from Committee Member to Secretary. Dale is ideally suited as his extensive background in governance and organisational administration is also welcomed. All positions requiring further approval processes by Anzac House have been confirmed.

Veteran Support:

The future of the Regional Veteran Centres Program (RVCP), of which the CVVSC are part of, has centrally changed. RSL Vic was originally the conduit for BEST funding that is applied for on an annual basis through DVA to be administered by CVVSC. The CVVSC currently has funding up until June 2024. As RSL Vic is not continuing the BEST Funding application process, and as CVVSC is a

registered charity, has its own ABN and has its own board of management, CVVSC will be able to apply directly for BEST Funding on their own. RSL Vic and CVVSC are currently in discussions on this front.

2024 Anzac Day:

Planning is well underway for next year's Anzac Day, another very special occasion. I am proud to share that next year's Anzac Day march in Bendigo will be led by peacekeepers and peacemakers. Peacekeeping is a proud tradition; Australians were among the first international peacekeepers to be deployed in 1947 as part of a United Nations operation. Since then, more than 40,000 Australians have served with Multinational Forces to unite, to maintain or restore world peace and security. This is something we are proud to honour next year on 2024 Anzac Day.



Awards:

The Sub-Branch, staff and volunteers have been nominated for awards at the RSL Victoria Hall of Fame Awards Night. The outcome was that the Sub-Branch attained a Hall of Fame Commendation Award for the best 10A (large) Sub-Branch, Life Member Stephen Burke attain a Hall of Fame Inductee Award and Achievement and Encouragement Awards were presented to our Head Chef Pardeep Taya, Events Coordinator Ratna Holland and Duty Manager Graeme Towler.

The Bendigo District RSL Sub-Branch, had also been nominated for the Awards Australia Charitable Foundation: Mental Health and Wellbeing Award. Though unsuccessful, The Bendigo District RSL Sub-Branch were finalists amongst many highly regarded organisations and individuals in this category. Again, another highly esteemed and recognised outcome. An outstanding effort overall, and I thank all staff and volunteers in supporting our Veterans and the Veteran community as a whole.

The Veteran support team has been hard at it over the last few months. As you can see from the chart above, they have been busy organising activities and classes for local the Veteran community.

In addition to the reoccurring yoga, golf, morning teas, crossfit and monthly group walking sessions they have run a number of excursions and outings to benefit Veterans.

These have all been well attended and reports received indicate that attendees have been well pleased with the efforts of the welfare/wellbeing team.

We encourage more veterans to participate in these events. They are run entirely for the benefit of veterans and dependents. We would love to see new faces at the events. If any Veterans are in the least bit interested in attending, please reach out. We would love to see you here.

VETERAN SUPPORT- WELFARE

Executive Summary:

The Welfare Program delivers direct proactive intervention, connection and support to the Bendigo and district Veteran community through face to face and telephone contact, and off-site visitation. Service personnel identified through networking / word of mouth / direct referral are supported inhouse and followed up directly by the Welfare Advocate. Other personnel are connected to appropriate adjunct agencies to facilitate both autonomous support and ease of access to those support interventions.

The Welfare Program continues to instigate strong networks with all local and Statewide ESOs to establish and cement sound relationships of support, trust, and integrity.

Veterans Engagement and Support:

The Welfare Sub Committee has continued the initiative that it commenced in the previous quarter to contact all identified Veterans within the district. At the time of writing more than 500 individuals – out of close to 900 - have been contacted and offered welcome, connection, support, and assistance on their terms.

This process has identified "hidden Veterans". These Veterans not being on the database or being secreted in aged / infirmed care - and who can be followed up as a matter of priority.

Financial Assistance:

The Welfare Program receives requests for financial assistance from Veterans across a range of needs. Financial assistance has been provided to address such issues as:

- (i) the completion of routine domestic tasks.
- (ii) relocation expenses.
- (iii) short term emergency accommodation.
- (iv) the hardship brought on Veterans who live with minimal fixed income.
- (v) the provision of food/petrol vouchers or the delivery of frozen meals.

Prompt interventions enable Veterans to attain the support they need, when they need it, and without the need to experience further embarrassment or humiliation that might accompany cap-in-hand external crisis agency requests.

Recent examples of this assistance have included:

(i) supporting a Veteran, impacted by mental health issues, who is living on fixed minimal income.
(ii) A local TPI Veteran whose father-in-law died interstate and whose mother-in-law then had to move into fulltime care. He has 3 dependent children living at home, and his wife works very minimally. He requested support to move goods and chattels from Adelaide to Bendigo. The Welfare Advocate approached the Welfare Chair and BDRSL President who authorised immediate support.


Welfare Funeral Support:

Included as a component of holistic welfare is the delivery of the RSL Funeral Ritual at Veteran's funeral services. This is delivered by suitably qualified staff to ensure that Veterans are accorded appropriate recognition of their military commitment at their last parade. Additional personnel have recently been recruited to this volunteer role.

Outreach:

An aggressive networking and outreach strategy has been pursued by the incumbent Welfare Advocate. We have reached out to ESOs who have been in contact with key personnel. On-site visits have taken place with regional RSLs and key support agencies – Legacy, CVVSC, VVA, Open Arms and Carry On.

With the assistance of Veteran members, several local Lifestyle Communities have been approached and former service personnel invited to a social gathering and connection opportunity. Further outreach to local nursing homes and supportive accommodation residences is bookmarked for the near future.



(i) Total contacts include ad hoc walk ins, telephone & F2F contacts, visitations, and external referrals in to BDRSL.

(ii) External referrals assistance includes support for DVA health & compensation issues, legal advice, welfare /financial support, Veteran's support services, accommodation, and mental health support.

(iii) Financial assistance includes individual food / fuel vouchers, utilities support, accommodation, transport, home / garden maintenance support.

(iv) Meals distributed includes individual fresh and frozen takeaway meals only.

(v) Practical assistance includes assessment/authorising of home maintenance tasks, pickup from individual homes to appointments, liaising with 3rd parties etc.

(vi) External representation includes any initiated networking and collegial opportunities with sector colleagues and associated agencies.

(vii) Home visitations include nursing homes and private residences.

The program continues to foster a strong and supportive community for Veterans in the region by supporting their pathway from "welfare to wellbeing" and providing a dignified pathway for ease of access to support that transition.






APPEALS

Challenges

The biggest challenges facing us for future Appeals are the economic environment and our internal sustainability. Appeals is very much within our control. We can only do this by increasing our number of Appeals volunteers and, attracting younger volunteers. There are a few things to consider: The overwhelming majority of our volunteers are over 65 or even 70 years of age and, with the greatest will in the world, there comes a time for us all when we can no longer give the support we used to or wish to give.

We currently operate 10 Selling Locations for the nine days of each Appeal with a total of 360 volunteer-shifts. Not including special events.

Our Sub-Branch has a membership of more than 789 Service members and 646 Affiliate members the groups that benefit most from our Appeals fund-raising. This year less than 6% of Service members and less than 7.5% of Affiliates physically supported our Appeal.

We need to increase the number of available volunteers, starting with the upcoming 2024 ANZAC Appeal. If numbers do not increase we will need to decrease the number of selling locations or decrease the number of days we sell. Either way, this will significantly decrease the funds we raise and make available to our Veterans and their families.



COMMEMORATIVE ACTIVITIES



On 31 October 1917, the 4th Australian Light Horse Brigade stormed the town of Beersheba to seize control of the town from the Ottoman Empire. This successful cavalry charge heralded the beginning of the end for Ottoman control of Palestine, and ensured the name of Beersheba would be forever remembered in Australian history because of its daring cavalry charge. Never would history see such a full-scale charge again.



A remembrance service was held in the memorial garden at the Bendigo RSL to commemorate the bravery and sacrifice of 4th Australian Light Horse Brigade 106 years ago.

Dale Hodges, chair of the Commemorative Activities Sub-Committee was MC for the service with speaker Stafford Kelly CSM providing an inspirational and stirring speech to the small but attentive crowd.

Remembrance Day services at both Eaglehawk and Bendigo were once again well attended with good crowds paying their respect.

Paul Penno OAM officiated for the Eaglehawk service at the newly refurbished war memorial while Nicole Hodges – Commemorative Activities Sub-Committee member, directed proceedings at the Bendigo service. Capt. Amy Murtagh was the guest speaker for the service at the Bendigo Military Museum forecourt.

The Commemorative Activities Sub-Committee continues to uphold the legacy of our Veterans through meaningful commemorations and community engagement. The dedication of the members and their commitment to preserving history remains the cornerstone of our efforts.

BENDIGO MILITARY MUSEUM

The Bendigo Military Museum continues its efforts to preserve and showcase the rich military history of our region. The subcommittee and volunteers are focused on enhancing museum exhibits, engaging with the community, and planning for future initiatives.

The 38th Bn 1st AIF Exhibition will wrap up at the end of the month and we will kick off 2024 with an exhibition from the Golden Rivers Artists. Overall, our exhibition schedule for the rest of 2024 is firming up with the recent inclusion of the peacemaking, peacekeeping and peacebuilding exhibition in the March to May timeframe.



Our cataloguing team continues to do great work in cataloguing all BDRSL Sub-Branch Memorabilia on the Victorian Collections Database. They have catalogued 6989 items as of 8th Dec 2023 which is a great effort. A reminder that anyone can view this collection online at <u>www.victoriancollections.net.au</u>.

We have now engaged two students from Deakin University to assist us with our museum work. One will work locally and the other remotely and both have been allocated 100 hours to assist us and to develop their skills. It is likely we will get additional students as Melbourne University has recently asked their students for Expressions of Interest to work at the BMM.

We have grant applications in the pipeline and if successful, will fund what we are calling an "audio storyscape" for the BMM. This will take the BMM to a new level with the use of innovative technology to create an immersive experience for visitors. Simply put, visitors will be able to interact with the various display spaces in the BMM as they move throughout the building through the use of videos, headphones and smartphones.

As always, we can't do anything without our band of dedicated volunteers, and we truly appreciate their efforts and selflessness.

On this night however, she was able to fold \$1000 into her pocket. Congratulations Donna.


